Our hope is that our actions, words, and hearts demonstrate this to our guests, donors, volunteers, and our community.

Love that Grows

Everyone knows veggies and fruit are important to our diet. They contain vitamins, minerals, and fibre essential for good health. The Table cares for the health of the community and we are blessed to be able to provide fresh produce to our guests. We appreciate and are grateful for those who donate produce.

At The Table Food Bank we take donated produce of all kinds, food grown in our raised garden beds, as well as produce from our Food Rescue program and give it to our Food Bank guests and cook with it in our Soup Kitchen. We have raised garden beds located in The Table parking lot to grow fresh produce, but we only have so much space, and vegetables take time to grow. We encourage you to Plant a Row, Grow a Row. Plant and grow a row in your garden to be donated to The Table Soup Kitchen and Food Bank.

Slightly bruised produce is still good and can be used and enjoyed by others who need it. An initial instinct to do with bruised or slightly rotten produce is to compost it, but there are simple ways you can salvage this produce so it does not go to waste. Our Food Rescue Processors salvage the good parts of produce and utilize this food for cooking and baking. Thanks to our volunteers, we are able to use and put out produce that many people need and enjoy.
